

## Paolozzi: Magic Kingdoms & Paper Moons Symposium

Saturday 25 March 2017, 2pm - 6pm

Coinciding with the major retrospective of his work, this symposium takes it's lead from Eduardo Paolozzi's1985 exhibition *Lost Magic Kingdoms and Six Paper Moons from Nahuatl* at the Museum of Mankind, one of the first examples of an artist intervening in a museum collection. This is the starting point for discussions on collection, collage, design, display and the role of the artist in wider culture and society, bringing together key art historians to shed new light and perspectives on Paolozzi's wide ranging practice.
