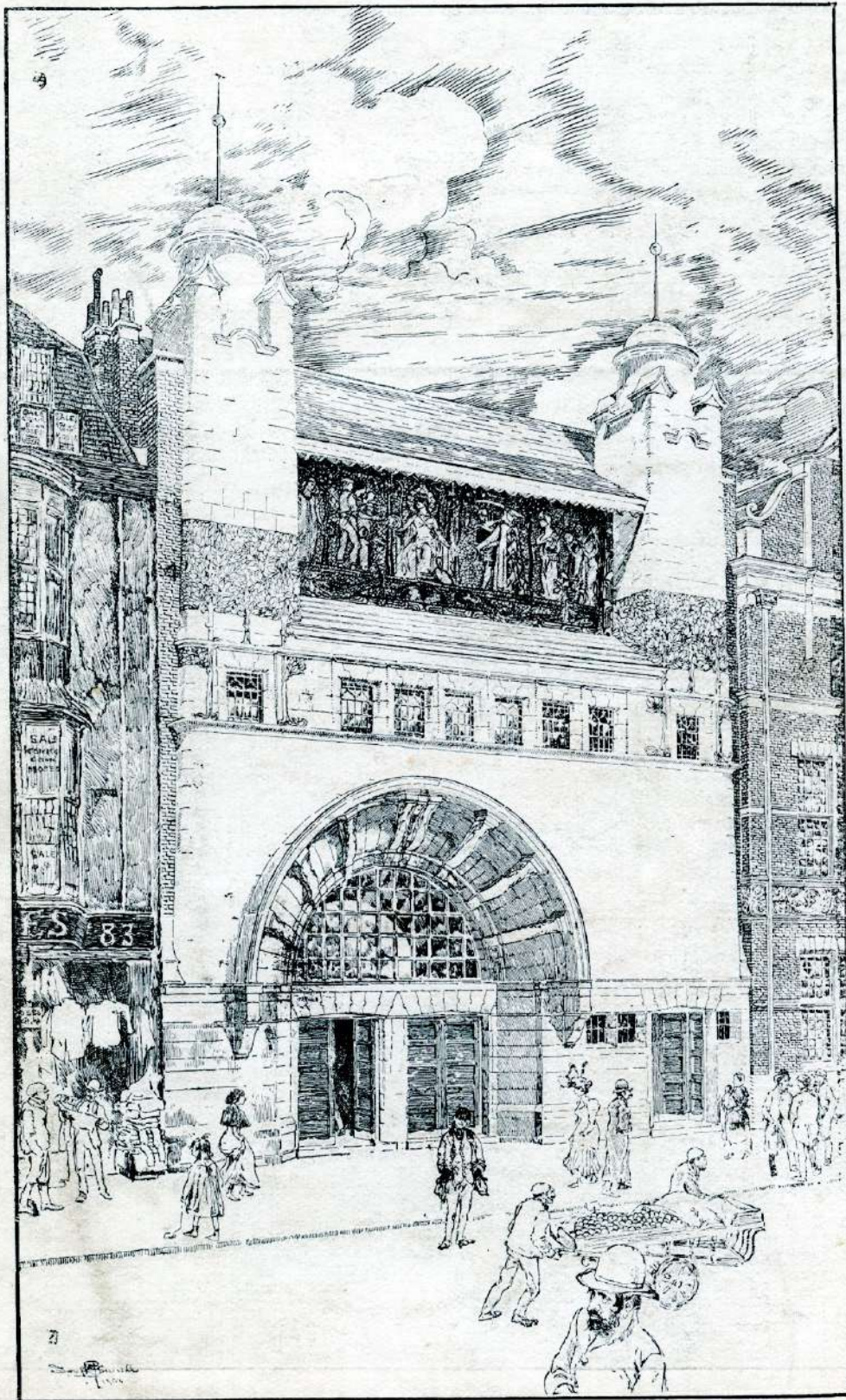


The Whitechapel Art Gallery.

Facts about the
Whitechapel . .
Art Gallery. . .

THE Gallery was opened in 1901 by Lord Rosebery, being the outcome of Exhibitions organised during a period of twenty years, by Canon and Mrs. Barnett, in St. Jude's Schools, Whitechapel.

Since 1901 twenty Exhibitions have been held, and nearly two million persons have visited them.

The Gallery provides, in the midst of a vast population crowded in tenement houses, a large, bright, airy place where people may come and spend among beautiful surroundings their rare leisure hours and carry away new interests and wider knowledge.

Many thousands of children pay organized visits to each Exhibition, and after short lectures and personal guidance write essays on the objects they have seen.

A large number of lectures, illustrated by lantern slides, are given freely in the evenings by lecturers with special knowledge of the subjects of the exhibitions to crowds of working people.

Concerts of good music are also frequently provided and greatly appreciated.

£1200 a year is already subscribed. The people themselves put another £100 in the boxes, but an additional £500 a year is needed if this effort to educate East Londoners through the eyes and imaginations is to be continued.

Finance.
